Sixty-seven (67) years strong, TVCC serves children and youth from before birth into young adulthood. Family-centred services are provided for individuals with physical challenges, communication disorders, developmental delays, and autism spectrum disorders. Services are provided in 10 counties of Southwestern Ontario and include specialized clinics, groups, participation programs, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, intensive behavioural intervention, psycho/social services, speech therapy, augmentative communication, seating and mobility, leisure, recreation and fitness ... to name a few.

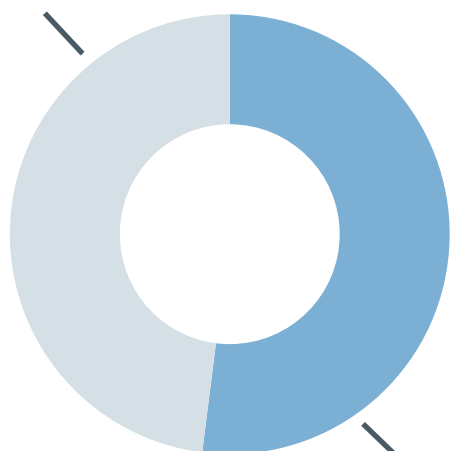

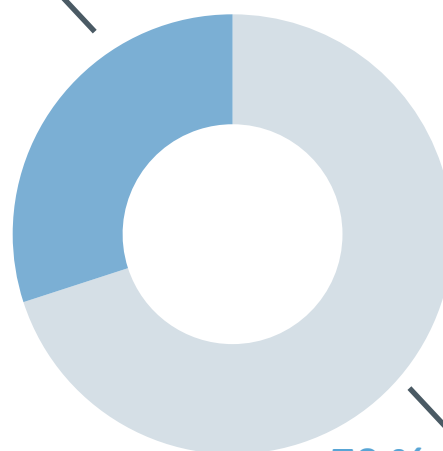

44% have served 1 to 5 years

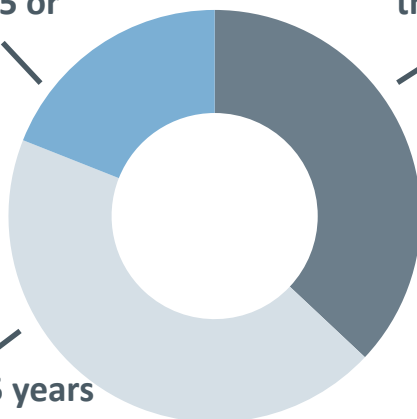
