Focus on Implementation

We did it! We set a very ambitious agenda for ourselves this fiscal year and we accomplished all that we set out to do. This was a specific phase in our long term plan dedicated to our getting ready for the changes to come in this province over the next 10 years in our field – while still offering as much quality service as we could across Southwestern Ontario. Since that is the objective we are most accountable for, we are again pleased to report that in 2012/2013 we provided over 210,000 hours of service to over 7,300 children, youth and their families.

In addition to our very important "business as usual" activities, this year we also achieved these major enabling objectives:

- Received the highest accreditation award possible from the Council on Accreditation of Rehabilitation **Facilities**
- Cemented the establishment, roll out and internal / external integration of our new community-based Applied Behavioural Analysis (ABA) program
- Commenced the transition to, training on and utilization of a new computerized clinical information system, GoldCare
- Began making the partnership with Children's Health Foundation real and functional

These activities and many others occurred in spite of again not having any base budget increase from our funding Ministry – and with the significant contribution of 5 unpaid days from all staff of the Centre. We are obviously in a province consumed by financial debt realities that have created an environment of austerity. This unyielding reality has finally touched us. A year ago, we were resistant to "hunkering down" in the face of this fiscal storm preferring to see this as a time of further foundational development, core service strengthening and preparation for future opportunities. We will continue these actions but within a different context.... a context of constraint.

We have a major, immediate challenge that is staring us in the face – the need to slightly reduce and re-establish stability in our services and workforce as a consequence of years with no increase in base funding. Even though, again, all staff of the Centre are contributing 5 unpaid days to assist with balancing our budget; it is not enough going forward. As always, we will employ a broad adaptive, collaborative strategy with considerable input from our clients and staff that will result in clientcentered choices that will define our Centre likely for the remainder of this decade ...

Ethan takes advantage of the programs and services designed for children just like him. Ethan has gained new independence to help him move beyond disability.

Grace was diagnosed with cerebral palsy at only 9 months old... the news was shocking for her family. Today, Grace continues to have treatment at Thames Valley Children's Centre. Grace receives Botox injections to loosen her muscles. She uses a walker, an ankle brace and a hand splint to give her the independence she needs to move beyond disability! No challenge is too great for this ambitious 7 year old, as she keeps up with her twin brother!



Zack, Age 11

Zack's parents knew their baby would be born with a cleft lip and palate. By the time baby Zack came into the world, he had an "incredible" support team waiting for him. From his speech-language pathologist to his orthodontist, paediatric dentist and surgeons, TVCC made sure everyone worked together. Today, 11 year old Zack is ready to take on the world; with his outgoing and energetic personality ... the sky is the limit!



Vikram, Age 13

Vikram was diagnosed with quadriplegic cerebral palsy at a young age. With the support of his family, and the Thames Valley Children's Centre, Vikram was able to thrive. Vikram uses a communication device to interact with his friends, family and community. He also uses a customized power wheelchair to get around. Vikram truly uses technology to ensure he has the independence he needs! Thanks to the support of his therapists at Thames Valley Children's Centre, nothing can stop this motivated young man from reaching his goals!

Cameron, Age 9

For Cameron, life hasn't always been easy ... Diagnosed with Down syndrome, Cameron has faced many of the complications associated with this condition, including respiratory challenges and a heart defect. Cameron has also been diagnosed with obsessive compulsive disorder and autism. Notes to Condensed Financial Statements

The condensed financial statements are derived from and are in agreement with the audited financial statements. The condensed statements consist of major subtotals and totals from the audited financial statements and exclude certain presentation detail and disclosures required by Canadian generally accepted accounting principles for not for profit organizations.

Administrative costs are allocated to the programs based on program costs as a percentage of overall operating costs of the Centre, staffing and occupied space. Donations and grants received for specific capital purchases are recorded as deferred contributions, and brought into revenue to offset the related amortization.

These investments are subject to market value fluctuations and the Centre records these investments at fair market value. Accordingly, the year-end market values and investment income for the year include unrealized gains of \$181,904 (2012 - loss of \$140,635).






A Wonderful Gift Creates a Legacy of Hope
