Repetitive Line Books (e.g., Brown Bear, Brown Bear by Bill Martin Jr., The Three Little Pigs by Paul Galdone, Me Too by Mercer Meyer)	 From Brown Bear, Brown Bear: "I see a red bird looking at me." "I see a green frog looking at me." "What did you do?"
Song Choices	 "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star." "Skin-a-ma-rinky-dink." "Wheels on the Bus." "Old MacDonald."
Drama	From Three Little Pigs: • "Little Pig, Little Pig let me in" • "Then I'll huff and I'll puff and I'll blow your house down."

Communication Situation	Sequential Messages
Games e.g., Simon Says, Red Light Green Light, What Time is it Mr. Wolf?, 20 Questions, Hide and Seek	From Simon Says: "Simon says touch your nose." "Simon says touch your knee." "Jump up and down." "Gotcha!"
News from Home/School	 "Guess what I did last night!" "I went for ice cream with my family." "It was yummy!"
Spelling Test	 "Everyone take out a pencil and paper." "Put your name at the top of the page." "The first word is" "The second word is" "Pass the tests to the front of the class."

Communication Situation	Sequential Messages
Geography	Record several province names and have another student identify the corresponding capital city.
Physical Education	 "We're going to run a relay race." "On your mark." "Get set." "Go."

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
